Complete all 20 items

- 1. Register with the Boy Scouts of America in your assigned position.
- 2. Plan and calendar a District Committee Training Workshop or complete the Committee Basic Training. Council committee may qualify by attending the Key Leader Workshop.
- 3. 50% of your immediate staff complete the District Committee Training Workshop.
- 4. Attend the monthly district or council staff meetings (7 of 10).
- 5. Plan to attend a Wood Badge training course.
- 6. Wear a full uniform and encourage your staff to be fully uniformed.
- 7. Review and understand your job description.
- 8. Review the national or local literature that describes your committee assignment. (See the appropriate BSA "Highlight" series.)
- 9. Develop an annual planning calendar for your assignment. (Boy Scout Chairman, Advancement, Outdoor Program, Finance, Relationships Chairman, FOS Chairman, Scout-O-Rama, etc.)
- 10. Successfully fill your staff roster at or above 75%.
- 11. Meet with your immediate staff - in your assigned area - at least four times per year.
- 12. Recruit a back-up for your position (two-deep leadership) or recruit another adult Scouter that accepts a Scouting assignment.
- 13. Provide recognition and appreciation to an adult Scouter.
- 14. Attend and give staff support to at least one district or council event per year, in addition to #18. Examples: District award banquet, Jamboral, Scout-O-Rama, Camporee, etc.
- 15. Achieve the Centennial Quality District or Centennial Quality Council Award or show a 5% increase of Centennial Quality Units in your District over previous year.
- 16. Complete Youth Protection Training.
- 17. Create a strong relationship with your district or council commissioner(s).
- 18. Participate in a district or council service project. (Example: Scouting for Food)
- 19. Visit a local Scouting unit's meeting.
- 20. Remember this is a boy program where the mission of the Boy Scouts of America is to prepare young people to make ethical choices over their lifetime by instilling in them the values of the *Scout Oath* and *Law*. Strong Values = Strong Leaders.
