Complete all 20 items

- 1. Register with the Boy Scouts of America
- 2. Attend or receive Fast Start training.
- 3. Attend New Leader Essentials and the Leader Specific Training course for your registered position (i.e. Boy Scout, Varsity Scout, Venturing).
- 4. Plan to attend a Wood Badge training course.
- 5. Attend the monthly roundtable training for fresh ideas (8 of 12).
- 6. Attend the monthly Key Scouters meeting and the unit committee meetings to correlate the Scout activities within your unit (8 of 12).
- 7. Wear a full uniform and encourage every adult and boy member to be fully uniformed.
- 8. Provide a Scouting program on a 12 month basis including advancement, outdoor program, and service program. (Use *Boys' Life* magazine as a resource.)
- 9. Work with the boy leader to plan the weekly, monthly, and annual program.
- 10. Use the patrol system and have the patrol/team/crew leader's council meeting to advance the plans for the unit.
- 11. Encourage the boy leaders to attend Youth Leadership Training.
- 12. Hold regular courts of honor and parents nights (at least four per year).
- 13. Attend an annual long term camp where opportunities for boys advancements can be met. (Council camps are recommended.)
- 14. See that boys learn service by having regular service projects (at least four per year).
- 15. Attend and support one district or council service project to help boys feel part of a large service oriented project; i.e. Scouting for Food.
- 16. Attend and support one district or council activity event per year where boys can see other Scouts function such as Scout-O-Rama, Jamboral, etc.
- 17. Achieve the Centennial Quality Unit Award.
- 18. See that the boys have an opportunity to react with other adult leaders through the merit badge program.
- 19. Create a strong relationship with the unit commissioner.
- 20. Remember that this is a boy program where the mission of the Boy Scouts of America is to prepare young people to make ethical choices over their lifetime by instilling in them the values of the *Scout Oath* and *Law*. Strong Values = Strong Leaders.
